

UNIVERSITY OF KWAZULU-NATAL

RULES IN RESPECT OF THE UNIVERSITY BOOK PRIZES

- 1. The Prizes shall be awarded in alternate years to the Humanities, Law & Management Studies and to Engineering, Health Sciences and Natural Sciences.
- 2. Books shall be eligible for the prize up to 4 years after date of publication.
- 3. The Prizes cannot be awarded to the same book more than once.
- 4. The monetary value of the Prizes shall be determined from time to time. The funds awarded may be used for self-initiated research. For 2007 the values are:

R30 000 if it is an authored 'academic' book; R20 000 if it is an edited book; R10 000 if it is an authored 'general' book.

- 5. The author must have been on the academic staff of the University of KwaZulu-Natal (including University of Durban-Westville and University of Natal) at the time the book was published and must be so at the time the book is being considered.
- 6. In the case of co-authorship or multiple authorship the contributions of the respective authors shall be made known to the adjudicating committee.
- 7. The address of the author submitting the book shall be reflected in the book as the University of KwaZulu-Natal, the University of Natal or the University of Durban-Westville.
- 8. The Chairperson of the University Research Committee shall act as a non-voting chairperson of the Selection Committee.
- 9. Two copies of each book must be submitted.
- 10. Other than in exceptional circumstances, at least two reviews must be supplied with books submitted for selection.
- 11. Monographs, textbooks and edited volumes shall qualify provided that the editor's contribution is considered to be substantial and significant (beyond that of mere compilation).
- 12. Books which are a compilation of articles which have previously appeared in journals will not be automatically disqualified.
- 13. Books in any of the European or African languages used in the Republic of South Africa shall qualify for submission and shall compete on an equal basis for the award.

- 14. Books shall always be evaluated individually.
- 15. A new edition of a book shall qualify as a "new" book if the Selection Committee has satisfied itself that the changes, additions and revisions make the new edition sufficiently different from the first.
